

Decree No. (1.5) issued on (, Article 3 (33) (13) (1) to implement the provisions of Law No. 13 (1) relating to the national electronic identification card.

The Head of Government,

Pursuant to Law No. 04.20 relating to the national electronic identification card, promulgated by Royal Decree No. 1.20.80 on 18 Dhu al-Hijjah 1441 (August 8, 2020);

and after deliberation by the Council of Government on 22 Dhu al-Hijjah 1441 (12 August 2020),

the following is decreed:

Article 1

The national electronic identification card shall be issued in accordance with the model attached to this decree and shall be valid for:

- Ten (10) years for persons over 12 full calendar years of age;
- Seven (7) years at most for persons under the age of 12 full calendar years, provided that its expiry date does not exceed the day before the minor reaches the age of 12 full calendar years.

Article 2

The national electronic identification card is issued and renewed by the Director General of National Security, accompanied by a secret code linked to each card.

Article 3

When applying for a national electronic ID card for the first time, the following must be provided:

- A copy of the relevant page of the family register, together with the register itself, or a complete copy of the civil status record, or a summary copy of the birth certificate. The latter two documents must not be more than three months old.
- A certified copy of the document granting Moroccan nationality, for foreigners who have acquired this nationality;
- The certificate of nationality provided for in Article 33 of Royal Decree No. 1.58.250 of September 21, 1378 (1958) enacting the Moroccan Nationality Code, if there is any doubt as to the nationality of the applicant for the card;

- Diameter of the coin: 38.61 millimeters; - Edge of the coin: serrated;

- Minting method: experimental.

- Obverse:

* In the center: Portrait of His Majesty King Mohammed VI surrounded by the following inscriptions:

"Mohammed VI - Kingdom of Morocco"

* At the bottom: Year of issue in the Hijri and Gregorian calendars
2020-1442

- Back:

* Top: The following restriction: "The 45th anniversary of the Green March"

* In the middle:

- Caption: "November 6, 2020"; • Aerial view of Dakhla;
- Atlantic coast.

- The Moroccan flag displayed in Dakhla's Al-Muntada Square in 2010 and selected by the Guinness Book of World Records as the largest flag in the world (409.78 square meters / 20 tons);

- Number 45;

- Nominal value in Arabic numerals and letters:

250 (two hundred and fifty dirhams)

- At the bottom: the following restriction: La de Anniversaire 45^{ème} »
Marche verte «

Article 3

The Minister of Economy, Finance, and Administrative Reform is responsible for implementing this decree, which shall be published in the Official Gazette.

Article 6

The Directorate General of National Security shall revoke the digital security certificates associated with any national card that has been reported lost, stolen, or damaged to the competent authorities, as well as those associated with persons who have been declared deceased.

Article 7

Applications for a national electronic identity card shall be submitted by the person concerned in person or by the legal representative of a minor to the national electronic identity card office responsible for their place of residence, in exchange for a dated receipt, taking into account the circumstances of persons with limited mobility.

Article 8

Applications for national electronic identity cards for Moroccans living abroad must be submitted to the relevant departments of the Kingdom of Morocco's diplomatic and consular missions abroad or to the departments responsible for national electronic identity cards in Morocco, in exchange for a dated receipt.

The persons concerned must provide a consular registration certificate indicating their address, as well as the documents specified, as applicable, in Articles 3, 4, and 5 above, with the exception of the residence certificate.

Article 9

The national electronic identification card must be collected by the person concerned in person or by the legal representative of a minor, upon presentation of the receipt referred to in Articles 7 and 8 above.

Article 10

Fingerprints shall be taken from persons over the age of 12 in the following cases:

- Application for a national electronic identification card for the first time;
- Application for renewal of the national electronic identification card due to loss, theft, or damage;
- Renewal of the card when the person concerned reaches the age of 12 full solar years.

Article 11

All procedures relating to the issuance of a national electronic identification card for a minor shall be carried out in the presence of the minor, accompanied by his or her legal representative, who must present his or her national electronic identification card and a document proving his or her status.

- A certificate of residence issued, depending on the territorial jurisdiction, by the national security services, the Royal Gendarmerie or, in their absence, the local administrative authority;
- Four recent, identical color photographs, taken from the front, with a light gray or light blue background, measuring 3.5 cm x 4.5 cm, showing the face and ears, without dark glasses;
- A copy of the national electronic identification card of the legal representative for minors;
- Updated stamp duties in accordance with the legislation in force. Article

4

A person requesting the optional indication of "wife," "widow," or "widower" must provide, as applicable, the following documents:

- A certified copy of the marriage certificate;
- A copy of the death certificate of the spouse; - A copy of the birth certificate of the spouse;
- Residence certificate issued, depending on the territorial jurisdiction, by the national security services, the Royal Gendarmerie or, in their absence, the local administrative authority;
- The national electronic identification card in his possession. Article 5

The national electronic identity card shall be renewed, in the cases provided for in Article 13 of the aforementioned Law No. 04.20, at the request of its holder or the legal representative of a minor, upon return of the card in his possession, accompanied by the following:

- Administrative or judicial documents justifying the reasons for renewing the national electronic identification card;
- Residence certificate issued, depending on the territorial jurisdiction, by the national security services, the Royal Gendarmerie or, in their absence, the local administrative authority;
- Four identical, recent, color photographs, taken from the front, with a light gray or light blue background, measuring 3.5 cm x 4.5 cm, showing the face and ears, without dark glasses;
- A copy of the national electronic identity card of the legal representative for minors;
- Updated stamp duties in accordance with the legislation in force.

Given the urgent and unforeseen nature of the matter, and at the suggestion of the Minister of Economy, Finance, and Administrative Reform, and after informing the two parliamentary finance committees, and after deliberation in the Council of Government held on 16 Dhu al-Hijjah 1441 (6 August 2020),

the following is decreed:

Article 1

I - In order to be able to adjust the accounts of operations carried out within the framework of the economic recovery plan relating to support for productive activities, and to keep pace with and finance major investment projects between the public and private sectors in various fields, starting from the date of publication of this decree in the Official Gazette, an account for specific purposes shall be created under the name "Strategic Investment Fund," and the Minister of Finance shall be responsible for collecting its resources and disbursing its expenditures.

II - This account shall include:

In addition:

- Amounts paid from the general budget;
- Amounts paid from local authorities;
- Amounts paid from public institutions and companies; - Amounts paid from the private sector;
- Amounts paid by any other public or private body;
- Amounts paid by international organizations and bodies; - Amounts recovered from expenses recorded in the account; - Donations and bequests;
- Miscellaneous resources.

In WANB for Madin:

- Amounts paid as fees for shares provided to the State in the capital of contracting companies;
 - Amounts paid as fees for investment projects under public-private partnerships;
 - Amounts paid, under agreements, to private sector companies; - Amounts paid, under agreements, to public institutions and companies

Article 12

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 6 of the aforementioned Law No. 04.20, the information that may be added to the electronic chip shall be modified or supplemented by decision of the Minister of the Interior.

Article 13

Decree No. 2.06.478 issued on 14 Dhu al-Hijjah 1428 (25 December 2007) implementing Law No. 35.06, which introduced the national electronic identity card, is hereby repealed.

Article 14

The implementation of this decree, which shall be published in the Official Gazette, shall be entrusted to the Minister of the Interior and the Minister of Foreign Affairs, African Cooperation and Moroccans Abroad, each within their respective areas of competence.
